Lesson 6:

"It is actually reported that there is sexual immorality among you..." 1 Corinthians 5:1–13

"...there is sexual immorality among you..." [1 Cor 5:1-5]

- 1) How does Paul say he knows what he does about the Corinthians? [5:1; cp 1:11; 16:12, 15-18; however, consider also the rendering in Young's Literal Translation ("is actually heard of"), Darby Translation ("universally reported"), and Webster's Bible ("reported commonly")]
 - -- What is the shocking thing that Paul has learned about them, and just how bad is it? [5:1]
- 2) What has been the Corinthians' posture regarding this shocking and sinful situation? [5:2]
 - -- How does this fit with the context of what Paul has been talking about? [cp 4:8, 10, 18; etc]
 - -- What *two* things should the Corinthian brethren have done, but which their pride has kept them from doing? [5:2]
- 3) What does Paul say that he has done, even from afar? [5:3]
 - -- Since Paul is not *physically* there with the Corinthians, in what way does he say he has been able to "judge" this man? [5:3-4; cp 2:14-16]
- 4) Who gives Paul (and the Corinthians) the authority to judge this man? [5:4]
 - -- In practical terms, when should they make their judgment regarding this man? [5:4]
- 5) What does Paul tell them (as one who has already judged this man in Christ) their decision should be regarding this sinner? [5:5a] What does this mean?
 - -- What is the first thing that should happen as this man is "delivered" to Satan? [5:5b]
 - -- What is the desired final result of this action? [5:5c]

"...there are contentions among you" – 1 Corinthians 1:10 – 6:20

"Your glorying is not good" [1 Cor 5:6-8]

- 1) What does Paul say the Corinthians have been doing? [5:6; cp 1:12, 27-31; 3:18-23; 4:5, 18; 5:2]
 - -- While they have been busy arguing about men, what have they apparently forgotten? [5:6]
- 2) What is Paul's exhortation to them, then? [5:7a; cp Exodus 12:14-20]
 - -- From the context, what two things might Paul be describing as "leaven"? [5:7a; cp 5:2, 6]
 - -- What does Paul declare about them, in general terms, even as he corrects them? [5:7b]
 - -- What does Paul use as "proof" of this being their condition? [5:7c; cp Exodus 12:1-3, 6, 18]
- 3) Seeing as this is their (our!) condition in Christ, what should be their (our!) main concern? [5:8a]
 - -- As they purge out the "old leaven" of malice and wickedness, what is the new "unleavened bread" that should be a part of the "feast"? [5:8]

Do not "keep company" with sexually immoral brethren [1 Cor 5:9-13]

- 1) What does Paul say he had already written to them in a prior epistle? [5:9; cp 2 Thessalonians 3:14]
 - -- What does Paul say was **not** his point in that prior epistle? [5:10]
 - -- Besides the sexually immoral, who else had Paul warned them not to "keep company" with? [5:10]
 - -- Why would this exhortation be impractical in their daily life? [5:10c; cp John 17:15]
- 2) However, what does Paul say was his point in that prior exhortation? [5:11]
 - -- What does Paul say they should not do with brethren who continue in such sins, and to what extent? [5:11]
- 3) Who is responsible for judging "those who are outside" (and, therefore, who is not)? [5:12-13]
 - -- However, who is responsible for judging "those who are inside"? [5:12-13]
 - -- What is the judgment that they should have made? [5:13; cp 5:2; Deut 17:2-7; etc]
 - -- Effectively, what would be the result of such a judgment? [5:12-13; cp 5:5]
